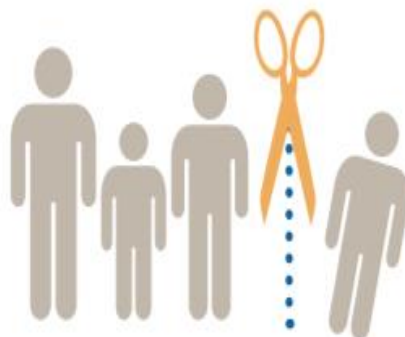
How Capping Federal Medicaid Funds Would Affect State Budgets

Cut Enrollment



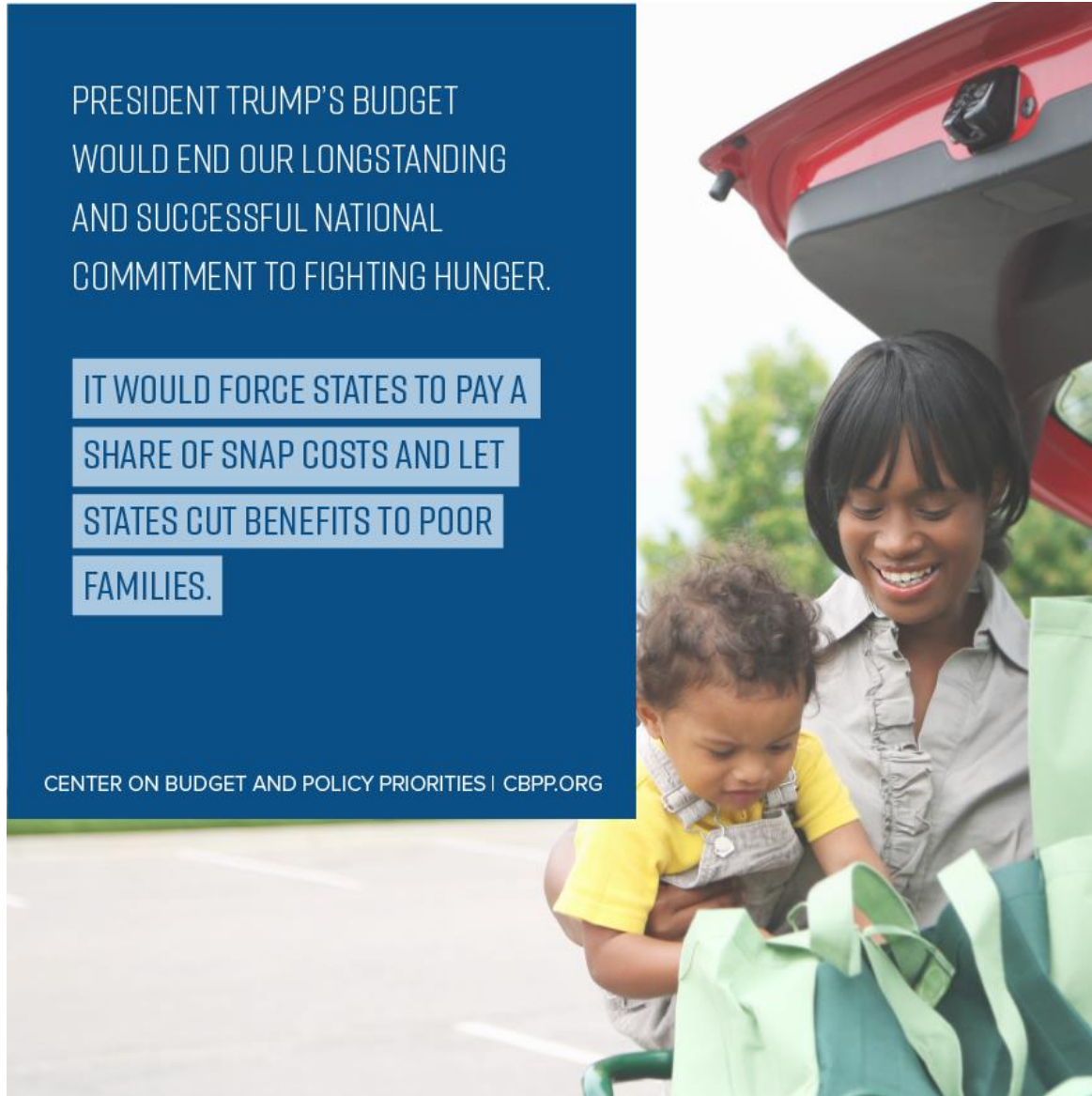
Cut Payments to Providers

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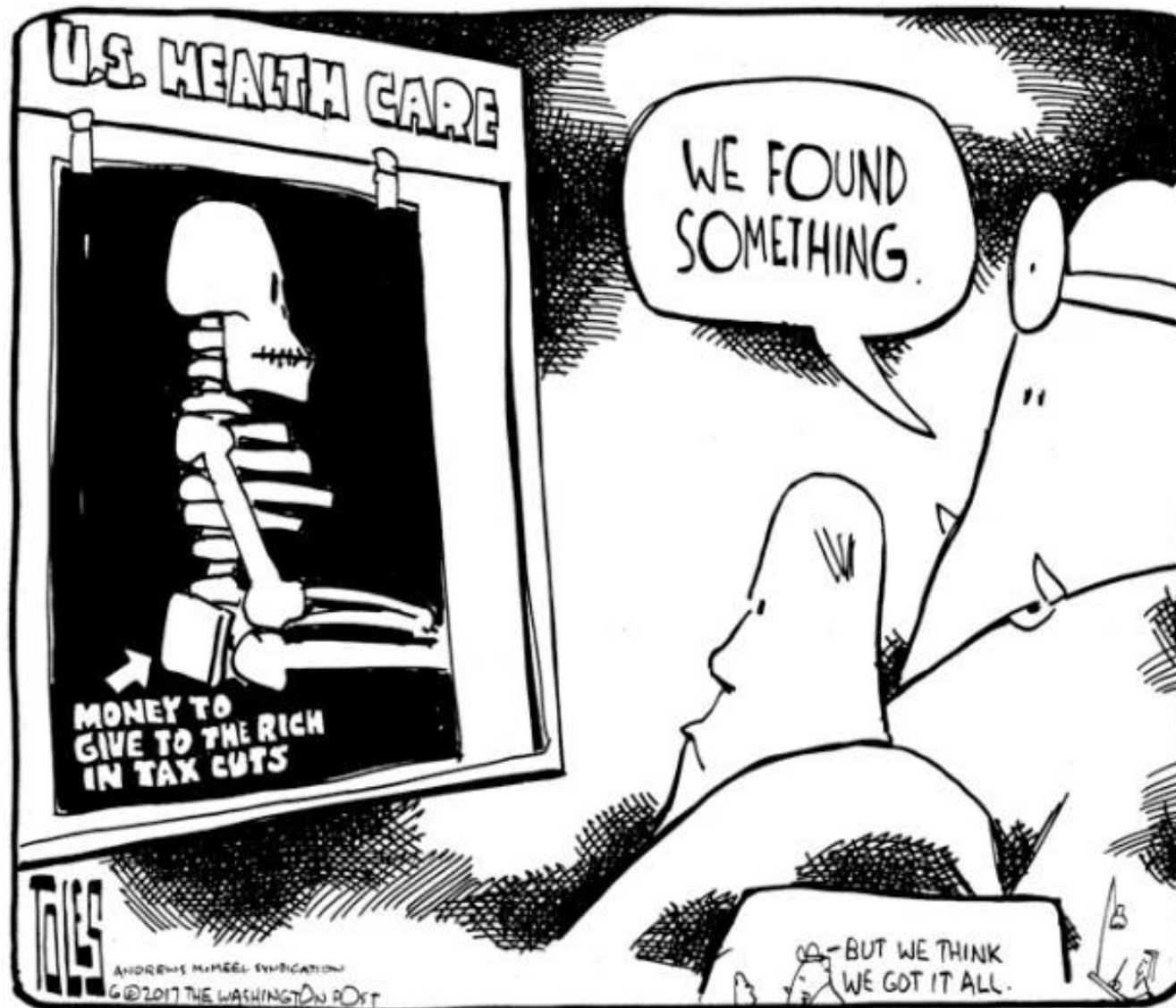

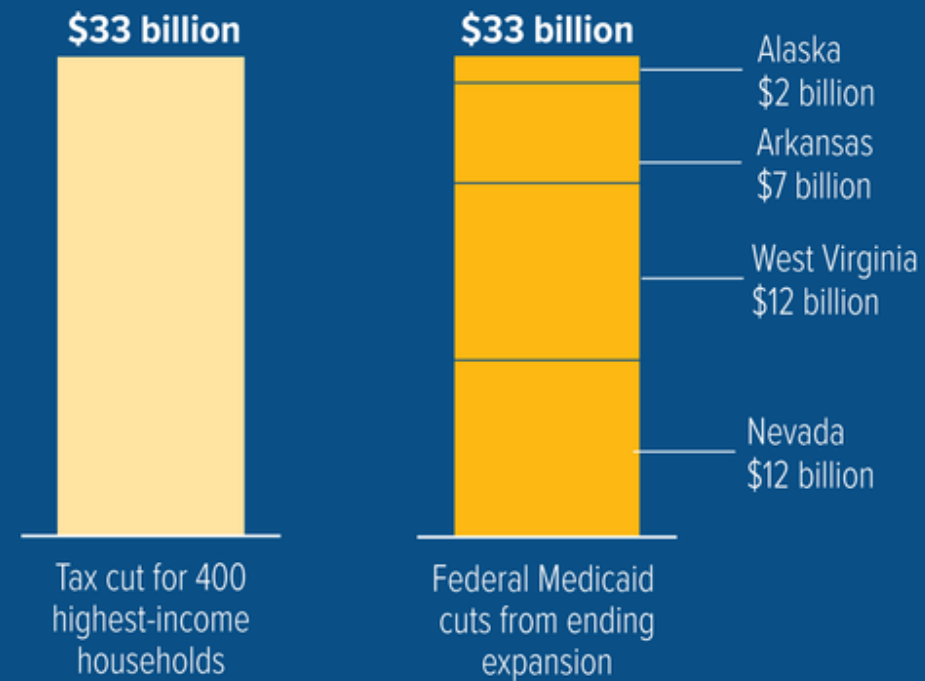

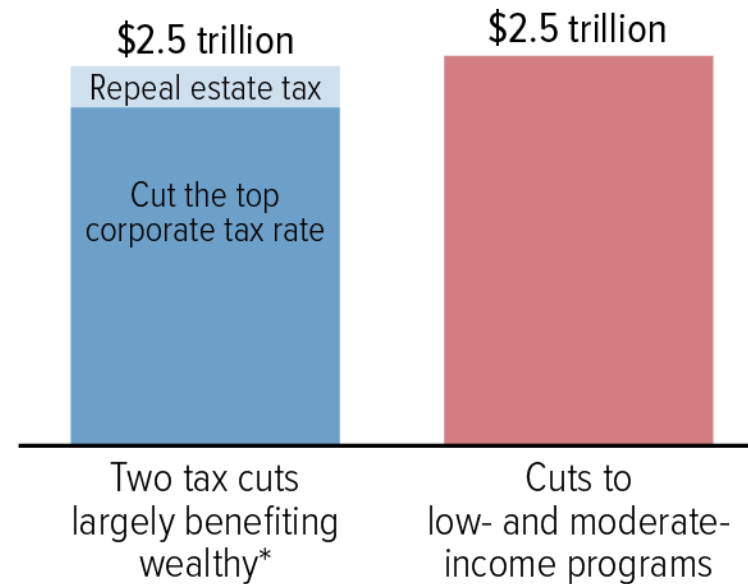

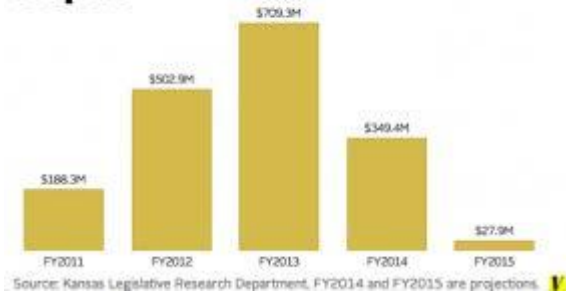

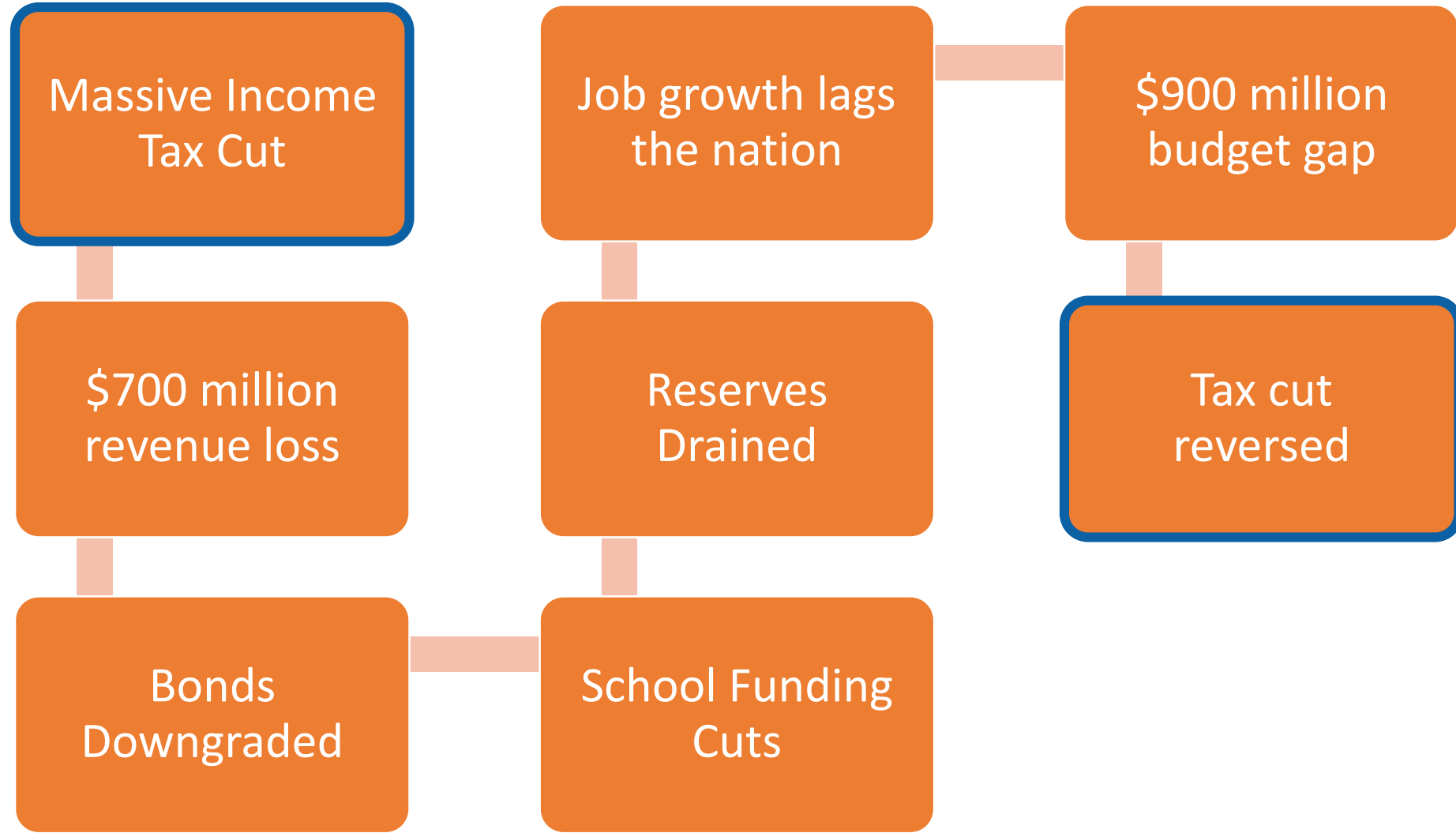

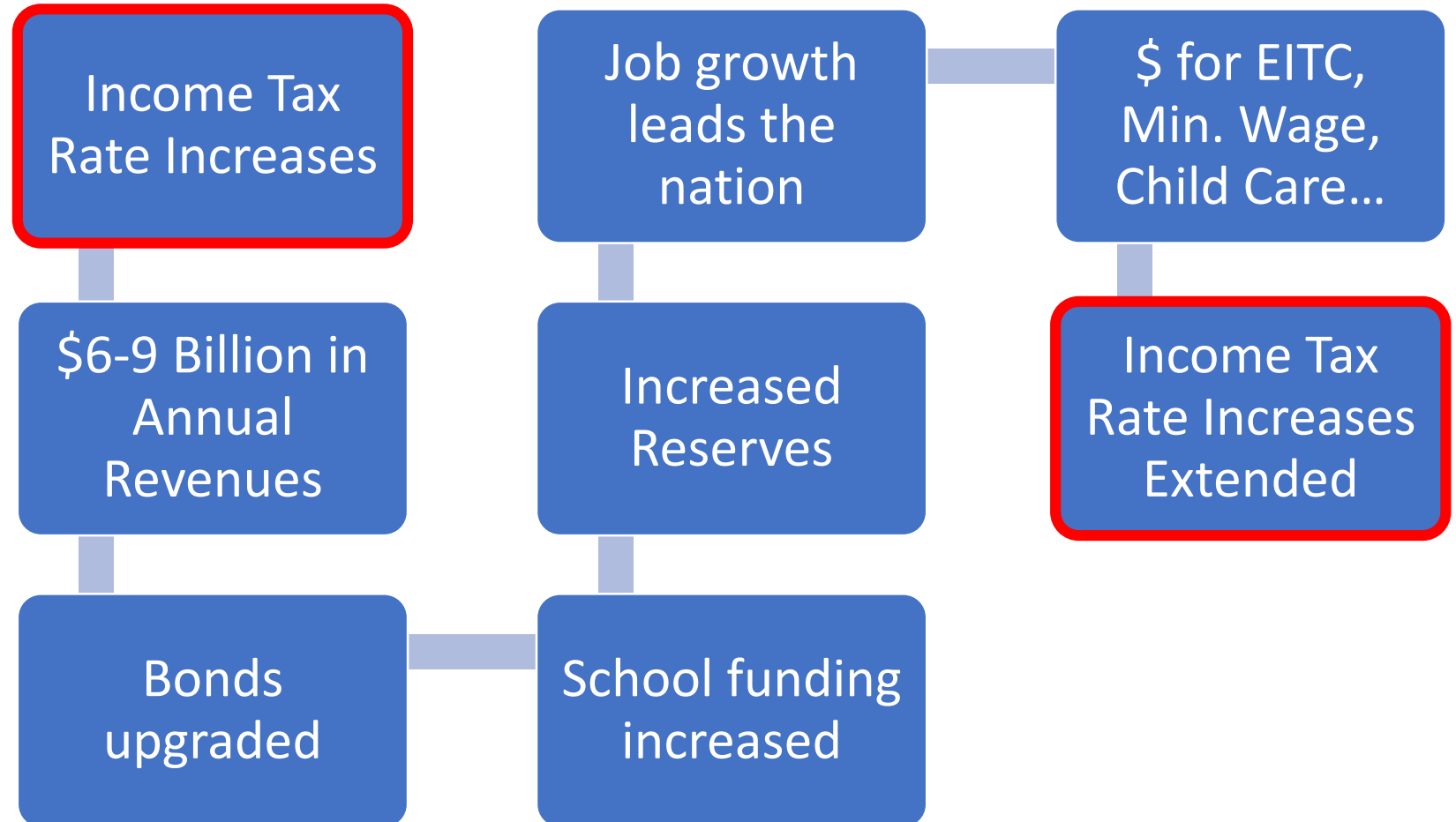

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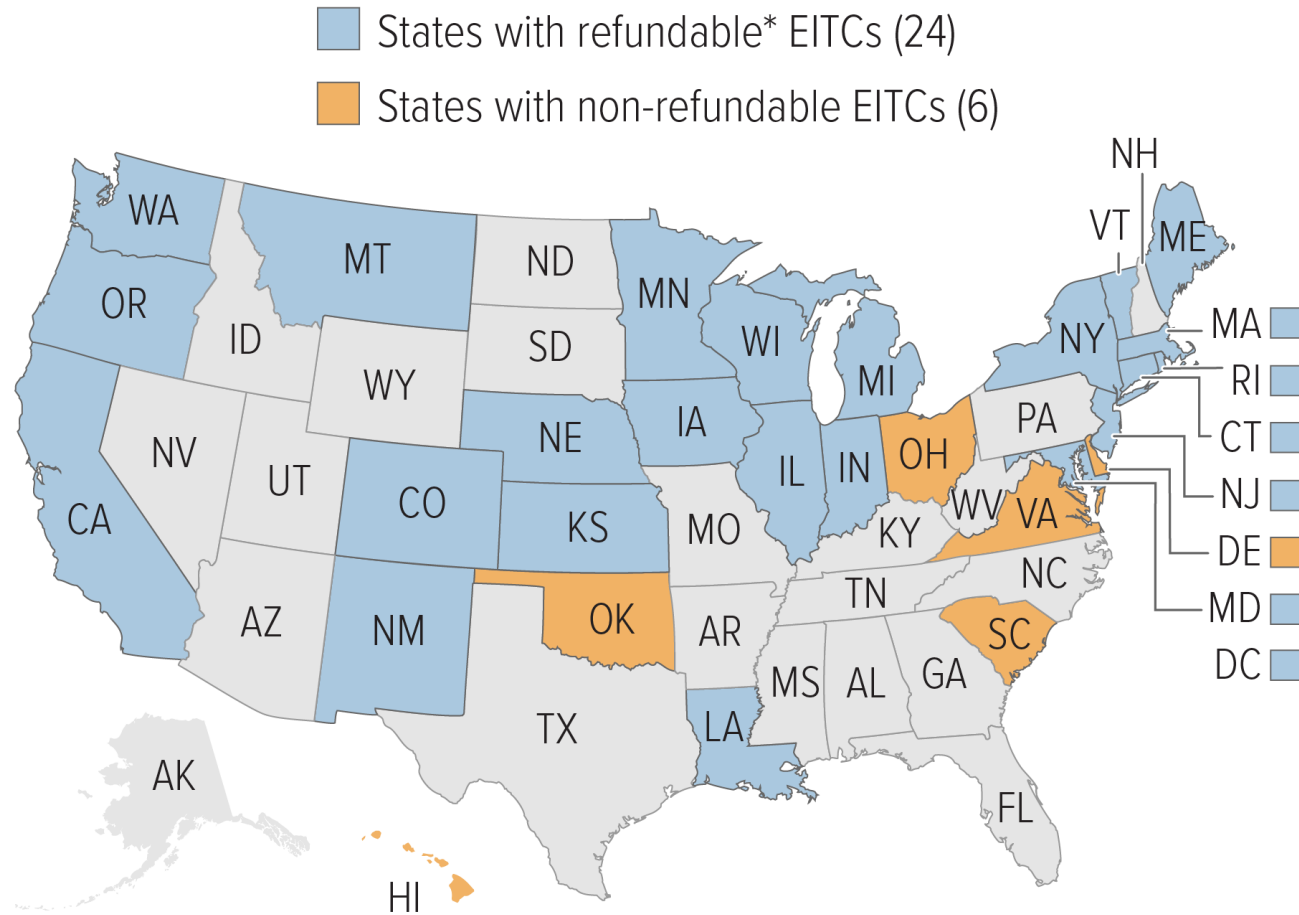




California Dreaming: 2012 - 2017



Twenty-nine States and DC Have Enacted EITCs, 2017

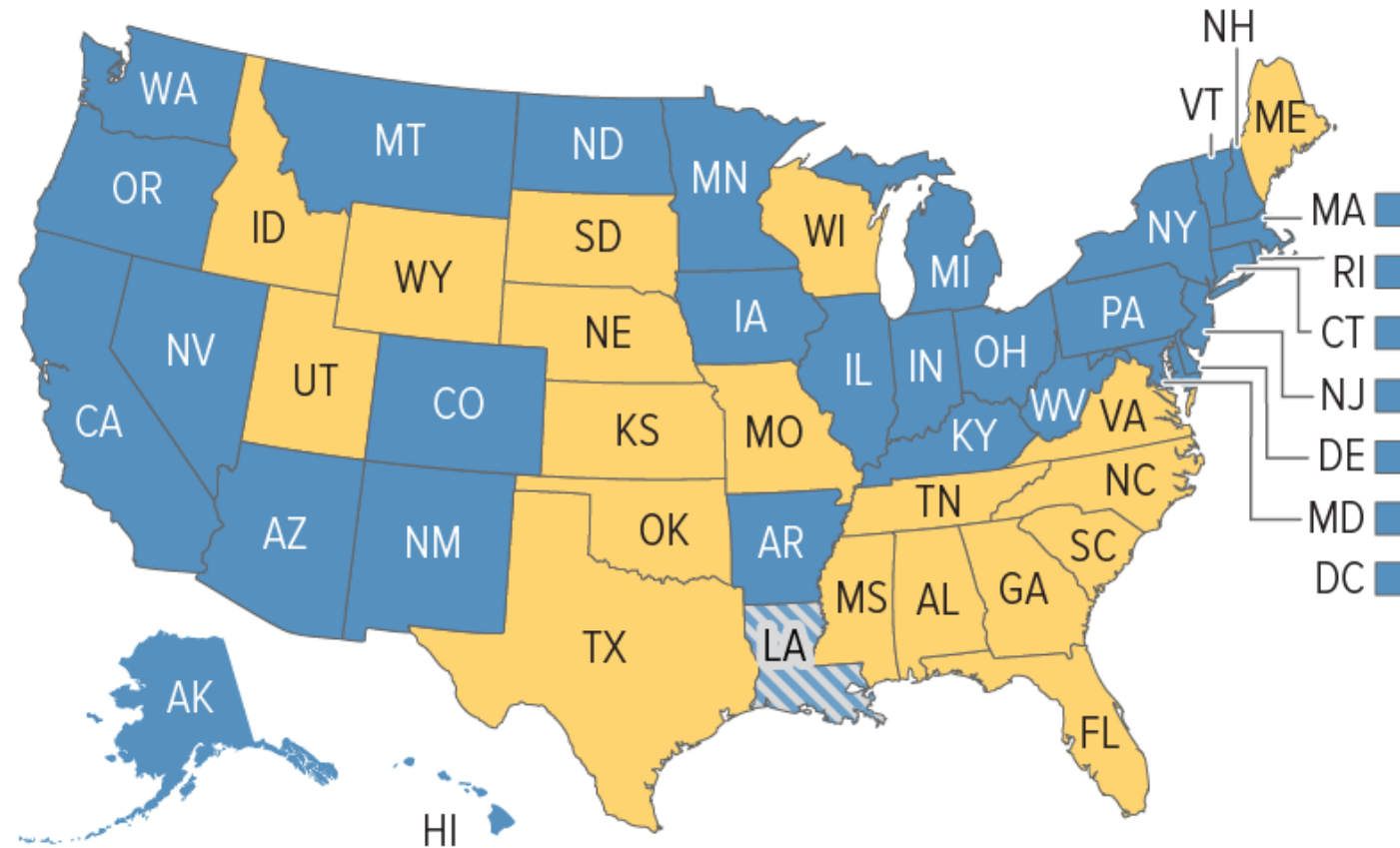


*Refundable EITCs give working households the full value of the credit they earn even if it exceeds their income tax liability.

■ Expanded (31) ■ Expansion effective July 1, 2016 (1) ■ Not expanded (19)

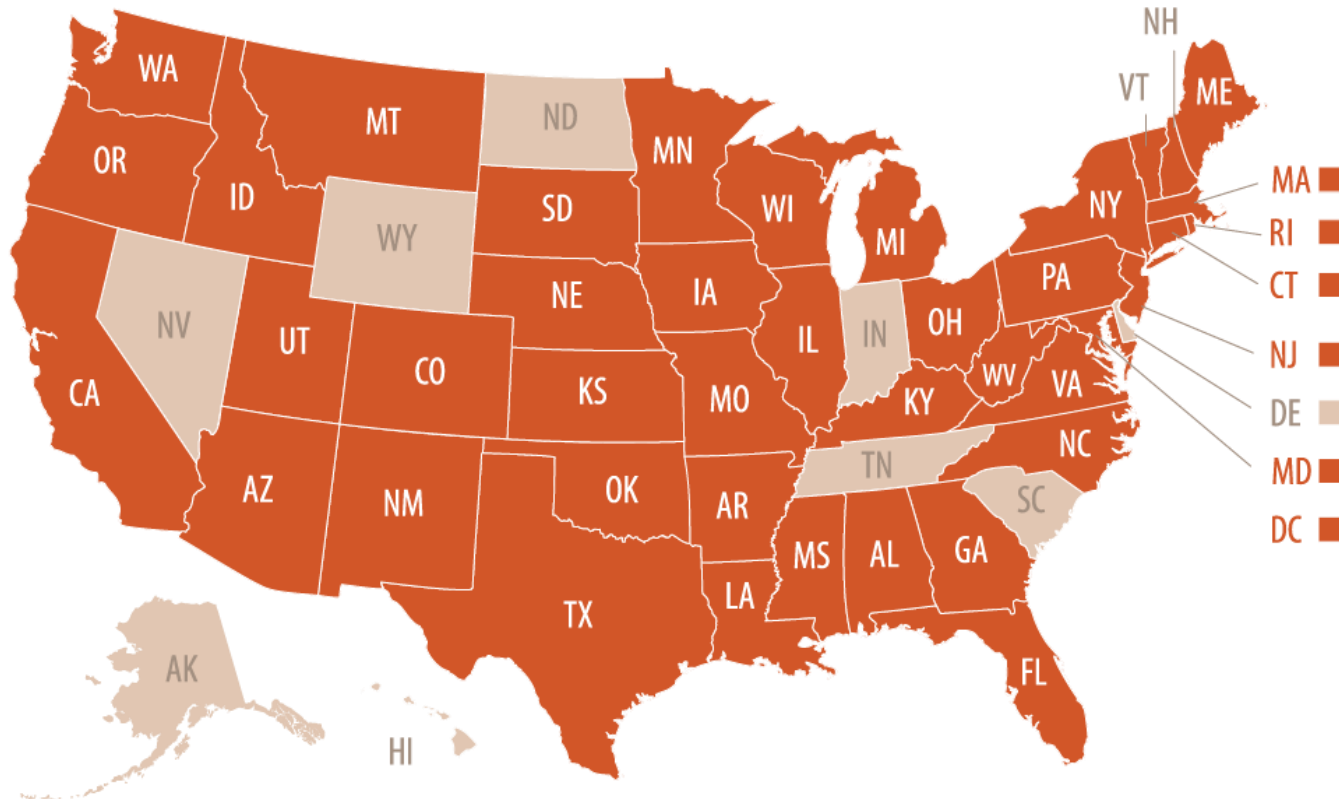
